It is of 5 people chopping a tree and collecting the wood in a graveyard. There is a decorative strip along the bottom of the sketch and it is signed by the illustrator. The frame is 15.5 x 18 cms brown timber finish with black edging.	EHFA 1	Good condition

It is of a building named "Café de la Boheme". There are a few people inside the café, a man repairing some bicycles in the foreground and a girl carrying a long pole with buckets across her shoulders. The sketch is signed by the illustrator, framed in a black frame 35 x 30 cms and has a cream mount around it.	EHFA 2	Good condition. There appears to have been a couple of corrections made. One near the tree, one on the mans shirt at the café entrance and again near his feet. The mounting appears to be a little mottled.

It shows a cat in a saucepan, the lid and some pegs are scattered around. The illustration is signed by the illustrator. It is framed in a pale wooden frame 36 x 36 cms with a beige mount.	EHFA 3	Good condition. The illustration appears paler in colour than the book image and the mount is yellowing a little. Elizabeth sent a little comment with this donation in an email. "The cat in the saucepan is that last final little pic. I like a little illustration at the end, to round off a story". She also wrote "I kept this rough because it had life. So often roughs have energy that the final illustration lacks."

A note from Elizabeth Honey in her email says "With Brave with Ben I was taken seriously as an illustrator. It was the first picture book, put a lot into getting references right, casting the characters, correct botanical details, the endpapers were a work in themselves."

We always had possums in our apricot tree eating the blossom buds and then the fruit, but these thieves always looked cute. Now the tree's gone and the kids have flown."

They are sketches where the illustrator was developing the character, Vanessa. They show her in bed, in her pyjamas and what appears to be her final outfit. Illustration "B" is in the book on page 27, it is of the crocodile signing fan mail with a tear in his eye and Vanessa sitting by him. The pieces are framed in a timber frame (47.5 x 43 cms) with cream mounting. They are both signed by Ann James.	EHFA 9	Good condition. Elizabeth says "Our family has always loved Ann James, both illustrations and person. Her drawings are always fresh and lively".
