UC EDUCATION STUDENTS	Children's Literature undergraduate unit (300 students) Semester Project studied books in the NCACL <u>Database</u> featuring 659 Aboriginal and or Torres Strait Islander books housed in NCACL temporarily in office area for the semester. Students were supported by NCACL volunteers. Students selected books, commented on these and designed educational activities for young people. Education Masters students studied a collection of Australian nonfiction children's books on the environment
